

I'm excited to offer even more training once we have this facility open and operational. For those that don't know, we have a Region 2B sub-office in Indianapolis and there will be no changes there. The goal is to make sure we are giving our members and leaders the education and training necessary to best serve the membership.



Speaking of education, twelve outstanding high school seniors from Region 2B UAW families have been awarded a \$10,000.00 college scholarship by the Richard T. Gosser Scholarship Awards Program. The Region 2B Retired Workers Chapter sponsors 7, \$1,500.00 scholarships as well. The Gosser Scholarship Awards Program, named in honor of the late UAW Vice President and Regional Director, Richard T. Gosser was established in 1962. Seven (7) of the Scholarships will be awarded in the name of Richard T. Gosser and one (1) Scholarship each will be awarded in the name of Ruthann Gosser-Harrison, Joseph Tomasi, Jack Sizemore, Lloyd Mahaffey and Ken Lortz. Including the 2024-2025 winners, 428 students have received Gosser scholarships. An additional 205 students have been awarded runner-up scholarships, thanks to our retirees. In all, \$3,491,000.00 in scholarships have been awarded since the program began in 1962. There is a call letter on our website for the Gosser Golf outing, which is our main fundraiser for these scholarships. I want to thank the local chapters for all their continued support for this great program.



Lastly, I want to thank the retirees out there. There were many that encouraged and supported me throughout my time on the plant floor. Making sure that I had the opportunities to go to different conferences and get the knowledge that helps me do this job every day. I firmly believe that the titles we carry as leaders are not as important as what we do with them. Leaders must build leaders. None of us are here forever and for us to survive, we need knowledgeable and qualified folks to carry the torch when we no longer can.
